Schedule a student visit for your child. All incoming students, including those not attending a school program and new incoming siblings of Baker students, must be met by Baker faculty.

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten applicants will be scheduled for a play visit in Early Childhood as part of the admission process. The visit is done in an Early Childhood classroom as a one-hour play visit party with their current peer group on **Saturday, February 10, 2018**. First grade applicants will visit for a half day (including lunch time) with peers in a Kindergarten class.

Second through Eighth Grade applicants will be invited to visit the school on specially designated days (8:30 a.m.-3 p.m.) in a class with their current cohort. Students should bring the following materials:

1. Book (that applicant is currently reading)
2. Snack (nut-free)
3. Lunch
4. Gym and/or swimwear
5. Appropriate clothing for outdoor play

In accordance with Illinois policy, Baker uses a September 1 birthday guideline when considering a student for admission.

- Pre-Kindergarten: 3 or 4 years old by September 1
- Kindergarten: 5 years old by September 1

School records and recommendation forms will be reviewed by the Admission Committee. Outside evaluations may be shared with the Head of School, Assistant Head of School, Division Coordinators, and Student Services. Occasionally, Baker staff may request permission to speak with a child's former or current teacher or other professionals who have worked with the applicant.
