- **Tech Requirements**

- All summer programs require access to a laptop or desktop computer, internet connectivity, and the most recent Google Chrome update. To ensure the best experience, we have instituted the Chromebook Loan Program.

- **Deadlines**

- Registration opens on May 29.
- Registration closes on June 5. We will offer rolling admissions as needed.

- 11:10 - 11:40: During their second synchronous Zoom session of the day, campers will update their peers and their instructors about their offline adventures! They can share great ideas, show off artifacts they've found or work they've created, seek feedback, and ask for support.
- 11:40 - 12:00: Campers will continue to explore the theme of the day - either online or off! Instructors will be available through 'office hours' for campers who want to chat, ask for help, or share their creations.
